**PERMIT TO ALLOW MINOR USE OF AN AGVET CHEMICAL PRODUCT FOR  
THE CONTROL OF EXOTIC BIRD SPECIES**

**PERMIT NUMBER – PER11367**

This permit is issued to the Permit Holder in response to an application granted by the APVMA under section 112 of the Agvet Codes of the jurisdictions set out below. This permit allows a person, as stipulated below, to use the product in the manner specified in this permit in the designated jurisdictions. This permit also allows any person to claim that the product can be used in the manner specified in this permit.

**Persons who can use the product under this permit:**

**QLD** - Suitably trained and experienced licensed Pest Control Operators (PCO) only.

**NSW** - Licensed Pest Control Operators (PCO) or Pest Management Technicians (PMT).  
- Suitably qualified and trained staff of the NSW Department of Primary Industries (DPI), NSW Livestock Health and Pest Authorities and the Lord Howe Island Board.

**ACT** - Suitably trained and experienced Pest Control Operators (PCO) who hold a current Environmental Authorisation and appropriately trained staff of ACT Department of Territory and Municipal Services.

**SA** - Fully licensed Pest Control Operators (PCO Grade 3 only) and officers of the Animal and Plant Control Boards authorised under the *Animal and Plant (and other special purposes) Act 1986*, appropriately trained National Parks and Wildlife Service Officers and RSPCA officers.

## CONDITIONS OF USE

### Product to be used:

RENTOKIL ALPHACHLORALOSE BIRD CONTROL AGENT

Containing: 990 g/kg ALPHACHLORALOSE as its only active constituent.

### Directions for Use:

Situation	Pest	Rate
Internal and external parts of buildings.	Pigeons and other exotic bird species.	15 grams of product per 1 kilogram of wheat or other suitable grain bait.

### Critical Use Comments:

Refer to Conditions of Use and Additional Conditions of permit.

### Jurisdiction:

NSW, ACT, SA & QLD only.

### ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS:

#### Supply

- The supplied product must be in a container that complies with the requirements of section 18(1) of the Agricultural and Veterinary Chemicals Code Regulations. Attached to this container must be a printed label being identical to the approved label.
- Sufficient and adequate information including a copy of this permit must be provided to the persons preparing for use and/or using the product for a bird control program to ensure safety to themselves, bystanders and the environment;
- A record must be kept of the identity of persons supplied with the product and the amount supplied.

#### Site approval

- Users covered by this permit are required to obtain an appropriate license before using the pesticide at any location. Additionally, each location will require written approval before the pesticide can be used.

## **Use**

- Persons who wish to prepare for use and/or use the products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the permit particularly the information included in Conditions of Use and Additional Conditions.
- Users must adhere to the label instructions with respect to the preparation of the product, application, protection instructions, storage, spillage and disposal directions plus first aid and safety directions.
- Treatments are to be made to external and internal parts of buildings only;
- Do not allow access of the public to the bait or areas containing the bait;
- Several free feeds are to be done before using baits treated with the product to establish whether native species are at risk. If native species are at risk no treated bait is to be used until such time as a location can be found that precludes native species;
- Bait stations must be used and must be of a design that will effectively retain the bait especially when used to control pigeons. The bait must be placed in a position where risks to non-target species are minimal and spillage of treated bait will not occur due to wind or other environmental factors;
- Treated bait can only be used when a licensed PCO or PMT or a qualified government officer is in attendance. No poisoned bait shall be left at a location unattended unless the bait station is inside a building and there are no risks to non target species;

## **Disposal of product**

- Destroy and dispose of used containers in the manner prescribed on the label;
- Do not contaminate ponds, waterways, streams, rivers or drains with the pesticide or used containers;
- The persons to whom this permit is issued is responsible for the disposal of unused pesticide and/or unwanted containers in a manner which will not constitute harm, directly or indirectly, to any person and/or the environment;

## **Adverse effects**

- The APVMA is to be immediately notified of any illness or injury suffered by any person and/or any untoward or adverse effect on the environment; as a result of:
  - Having the product in possession or custody; and/or
  - Preparation for use and/or use of the product;
- The APVMA must also be notified of any illness, injury or deaths caused to non-target birds and other wildlife.

## **Clean up**

- Upon completion of the poisoning program no poisoned bait may be left at the location. Users must remove any spilled bait or bait remaining in bait stations;
- All dead and affected pigeons and other exotic birds must be removed from each location after each baiting. If required, affected birds must be humanely disposed of in a manner which does not create public concern
